ERRATUM & CORRECTION

In the draft Minutes of the FOR-NY CBRS meeting held at OASAS on January 31, 2019, we inadvertently mischaracterized the forthcoming CRPA-Family certification currently under development by the New York Certification Board (NYCB) at ASAP.

NYCB confirms that the CRPA-Family certification is a CRPA parenthetic (or sub-specialty) of the Certified Recovery Peer Advocate certification. That is, candidates must be a CRPA in good standing to qualify for the additional training necessary. Given the nature of the parenthetic, this requirement for a preexisting CRPA is not subject to change, as we mistakenly suggested. We apologize for any confusion caused.
