### **OASAS Updates:**

- Orientation meeting for 14 awardees of the RCOC funding is April 10<sup>th</sup>
- 5 hospitals are being notified about being awarded for buprenorphine induction combined with peer support from outpatient providers
- FOR-NY providing scholarships for CRPA Training and OASAS helps cover exam costs via NYCB
- Funded 60 outpatient providers to hire and recruit CRPAs
- ROCovery Replication- expansion of at least 2 additional locations
- OASAS Regulations are being modified to require all outpatient providers to have peer services
- Modifications will be made to the clinical advisory panel document on peer services
  - Pre-admission engagement and outreach, limits on number of peer services combined with 25% increase reimbursement will be announced any day.
- CRPA-F Train the Trainer pilot is taking place on April 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> in Albany; invitations have been sent. Hopefully will be offered to everyone late summer/September.
  - CRPA-F is an additional certification and training for a family member who has had a child/adolescent in or seeking recovery.
- Learning collaboratives, Sylvia from OMH discussing Suicide Prevention. Contact Marialice for questions.
- Ombudsman (CHAMP) Program: Ombudsman is a fancy word for "advocate."

    - 485 cases have been opened, 250 have been closed.
    - Helping people with appeals; if you are denied access the first thing to do is appeal.

#### Questions:

- 1. When will CRPAs be state and/or federal employees? People don't want to enter the CRPA field because they only get paid \$15 per hour. Susan Brandau will address this question with OASAS administration. When the reimbursement percentage goes through hopefully that can increase wages for CRPAs.
- 2. When can CRPAs go through private insurance? Up to organizations to negotiate with them. Also something we need to advocate for.
- 3. Why are CRPAs being let go in Saratoga because of a grant ending? April 12<sup>th</sup> is these CRPAs last day. COTIs are the ones losing funding. Susan Brandau will look into this.
