 - **\$** YVM-Columbia County reviewed the toolkit and sent feedback so that there was youth involvement. This group started in March, they meet bi-weekly, and have about 20 consistent members, they also have developed a mission and vision!

New York Certification Board Update – Ruth Riddick 1:50 pm

- Tomorrow, 9/27, is the Brooklyn Recovery Conference
- NYS ASAP and NYCB are co-presenting the NYS Recovery Conference with FOR-NY
- Ruth is co-facilitating workshop on Peer Supervision as well as giving a workshop on Peer Ethics
 Upcoming peer fair in Rochester, November 20th. Details are to be determined. Opportunity for peers and potential employers to connect. Peers can bring resumes and network with potential employers.
- 1 October 2018- 1 August 2019, we added 450 Certified Recovery Peer Advocate professionals to the field!!
- July 1st CRPA-Family was introduced. The first requirement is that you are a full CRPA is good standing. There are 37 trainers approved to train on CRPA-F. This training is good for 20 hours towards renewal of CRPA and

- January 1- CRPA-Youth. Sub-specialization of full CRPA that focuses on youth. In process of developing this certification. Age range for people trained to be CRPA-F is 18-30

- Passed 4 pieces of recovery legislation in the last legislative session, one has been signed by the Governor which renames NYS OASAS to be the Office of Addiction Services and Supports!
 - 3 more will be going to the governor before the end of the year. These legislations regard:
 - A.7277 Naloxone kits and good Samaritan protection. Some people are afraid to administer Naloxone because they are unsure about consequences.
 - S This legislation hopes to add the good Samaritan rules onto the back of the blue cards
 - S Comments- Blue cards aren't being included in Naloxone kits anymore.

- A.7246 Medication Assisted Treatment for people on Medicaid. Now, people on Medicaid might be restricted with MAT access, as well as issues with prior authorization, delays time when they should be treated on demand
 - People under Medicaid, you would be open to whatever MAT drugs are necessary, between the patient and the doctor. Prohibit prior authorization for MAT to get people started right away. If your organization is in support of this, please email <u>aweingarten@for-ny.org</u> to be added to FOR-NY's letter of support
- A.1068: Quarterly reports from OASAS that look into the outcomes of initiatives created in response to Opioid epidemic. Report how the programs are going, age, sex, regional data so that we understand what populations are being assisted.
